GROW HUB's Donkeys, Lewis and Clark



Most of the people who come to GROW HUB during the year may be asking themselves these questions when they come to the nursery. I am going to try to answer these questions to the best of my ability. What do Lewis and Clark eat, and how much do they eat? Lewis and Clark eat pellet and sweet feed during most of the year. In the winter, they eat alfalfa pellets. In addition to everything that I have already said, Lewis and Clark also eat four slabs of hay.

How often do Lewis and Clark get fed? They get fed once a day. Do Lewis and Clark go to the veterinarian, or does the veterinarian come to them? The veterinarian comes to the facility once a year. When the veterinarian comes to the facility, she checks on the condition of each donkey. The veterinarian updates the shots whenever it becomes necessary. The veterinarian is very nice, and she answers any of the questions that we have about their health. When did GROW-HUB get Lewis and Clark? GROW-HUB got Lewis and Clark in 2018. Where did Lewis and Clark come from? They came from a place in northern Florida.

Are Lewis and Clark nice, or do they bite? The donkeys have been happy at GROW HUB. They contribute to the public relations & have become local celebrities. They are getting used to being approached by people but can get frisky. We always watch how their day is going, but they are getting friendlier all the time.
